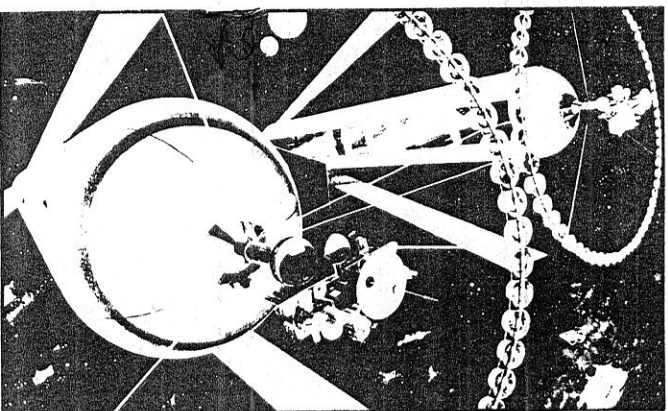

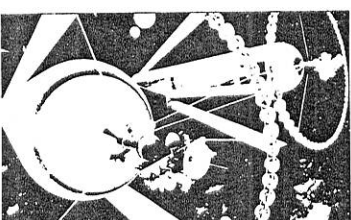

### **Freeland Conference**

The **FREELAND** Conference series studies alternatives to living in areas controlled by uncontrollable governments. Whether it is the search for unclaimed islands, space settlements, floating cities or underwater cities, the desire to live free in a non-coercive environment is the issue.



The next evolutionary/socialological change is likely to be the need for greater individual sovereignty. And that desire for sovereignty demands a world free of regulations, taxation and aggression. The **FREELAND** Conference hopes to signal the threshold of a new era, an era destined to unleash a new world of prosperity and liberty never seen before on old Earth.

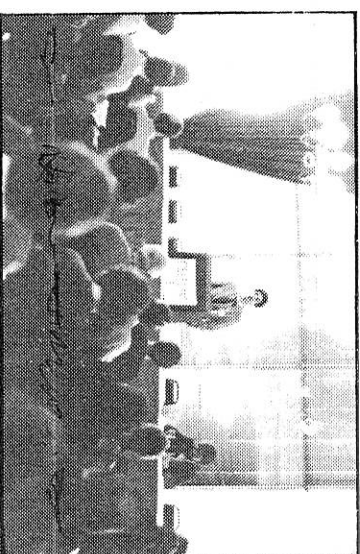
### **SPEAKERS:**



Poul Anderson

**Poul Anderson** has written over 80 books, mostly science fiction. Some of his more famous books include *Brain Wave*, *The Enemy Stars*, *The High Crusade*, *Guardians of Time*, *World Without Stars*, *Ensign Flandry*, *The People of the Wind*, *The Night Face*, *Tau Zero*, *The Avatar*, and *Orion Shall Rise*. Anderson has received seven Hugo and three Nebula Awards for best novelette of the year. He has also received the Tolkien Memorial Award for lifetime achievement in fantasy. Anderson majored in physics at the University of Minnesota, graduating with honors in 1948.

**Gary Hudson** has been an active participant in the space industrialization field for the last 13 years. In 1980 he started G.C.H., Inc., an engineering research and development corporation based in the San Francisco Bay area, to design and prototype launch vehicle systems for commercial use. Educated in physics and medicine, Hudson has published *Beyond Earth: A Personal View of Space Civilization*, as well as a textbook on the physics and economics of space transportation systems.

**Barry Reid** is the founder of Eden Press in Fountain Valley, California. Reid's first book was *The Paper Trip*, a unique approach to personal privacy through a change of identity. In 1976 he was interviewed by *60 Minutes* on how to create alternative identities. The U.S. Justice Department in 1979, annoyed at his activities and books, wrote that Barry Reid is a "hero to the underworld." He graduated from UCLA with a B.A. in Political Science and later received an M.A. in Spanish Literature.

**Terry Savage** received his BA in economics with honors at UCLA in 1981. Currently, he is pursuing his MBA in Operations and Program Management at USC. Employed as a Senior Business Administrator of TRW in the Spacecraft Engineering Division, Savage was one of the founders of OASIS, becoming its first president. He is also a board member of the L-5 Society and president of Space Systems, Incorporated.

**Bill Pozzi** received his BA at Cal State Fullerton and attended Pepperdine MBA School. In 1966 he joined the Navy Reserves to avoid the draft, but was sent to Vietnam as a member of the underwater demolition team. In 1977 Pozzi started Apollo Moving and is diversifying into real estate and the limousine business.

**Conrad Schneker** received his BS in Engineering Mathematics at the University of Arizona, and was also a graduate student in Systems Engineering. A writer for *Earth/Space News*, Schneker was technical/paper reviewer for the L-5 Society. He is the author of a forthcoming article in the *British Interplanetary Society's* publication. Currently, he is the Marketing Director at Green Hills Software of Pasadena, California.

**Wayne White** is a 1984 graduate of the U.C. Davis School of Law, where he participated as a member of the *Law Review*. White holds the Master of Administration degree from U.C. A founding member of the *Advancement of Space Industrialization and Settlement (OASIS)*, White has published several articles on "real property in outer space" in the *L-5 News*.

Personal privacy, financial independence and individual autonomy are just a few of the areas Reid will touch upon ("How to Achieve A New World of Privacy").

Savage will give an overview on how to develop, finance and build a free city on a moon, planet surface or asteroid. Savage will go into detail on the costs of building a (5,000 population) city in space and how to finance it privately. ("A Realist's Plan for Building A Free Country in Space").

Anderson has mainly written science fiction books dealing with science fiction. However, in his speech, Anderson will deal with practical problems and promises for settlers looking for a new world. Some of his speech will touch on possible commercial ventures in space, natural resources on other planets and the danger of altering nature. ("Space: Promise and Problems").

#### 2:00-3:00 pm — Conrad Schneker

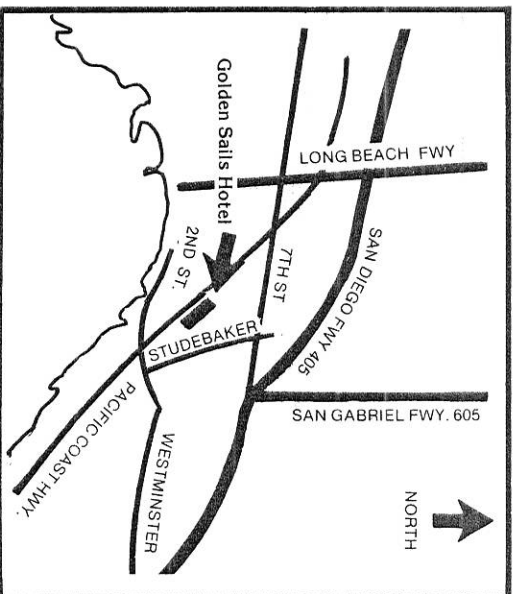
Liberty World is a proposed new country based on large anchored ocean colonies, similar in character to a floating Holland or Venice. It would be a refuge for the oppressed as well as a commercial center of space and underwater technology ("Liberty World: A Floating Free City of the Future").

#### 3:00-4:00 pm. — Gary Hudson

Hudson will discuss his new ideas on floating cities and their ability to become launching pads for traveling into space. Hudson believes that the Pacific Rim area will be the center of wealth and intellectual movements and the ideal location— islands, floating cities, free ports—to create a free society country. ("Liberty from The Pacific Rim to Space")

#### 4:00-5:00 pm. — Wayne White

White has extended property rights to outer space. Before space settlement can be launched, expanded definitions must be made to private property in space and on planets. ("Space Law: Real Property Rights in Outer Space")
