# JUNE 8 KARL BRAY WILL SPEAK

Karl Bray, author of *Taxation and Tyranny* and leading tax rebel in the United States, is finally out of jail. Charged on willful failure to file a tax return, Bray will speak to the general membership of SLL and friends of SLL on Tuesday, June 8 at the Keystone Savings and Loans located at 555 N. Euclid in Anaheim at 8 p.m. The building is on the corner of Euclid and Crescent and can be reached by the Santa Ana Fwy. (take either -depending on what direction you are coming from— the Crescent or Euclid cut-offs).

In an informal speech format, Bray will touch on his life in jail, the recent *Playboy* article (April edition) which highlighted Bray's struggle with the IRS and the publication of his next book.

Bray's speech will be short so that the audience will have plenty of time to ask Karl grueling questions. It is still tentative, but we are planning a small reception for Karl at the meeting place or at a near-by home. Remember, everyone is welcome and a donation of 50¢ will be asked at the door.

#### BRANDEN'S Speech

Dr. Nathaniel Branden's speech at Fullerton College on May 3 was a great success. More than 300 persons listened to Branden's informal speech on everything from romantic love to the Libertarian Party.

Branden made some interesting observations. Branden said that, "Nixon did us a great favor by showing people who favor big government what happens when government is powerful." This is why, Branden claimed, there is disillusionment with socialist and collectivist solutions.

As for the libertarian movement in general, Branded said that, "Libertarians are becoming writers, publishers, teachers, even political workers. This is the greatest time imaginable for libertarians."

But Branden had words of warning. He said that the United States is in a "schizoid state" in that culturally the United States is becoming more individualistic while politically it is becoming more collective.

It is "a complete fantasy to think that there can be freedom of thought without freedom of property," Branden said.

Branden's speech was sponsored by SLL and its chapters. SLL plans to have Branden speak again next year.

#### **Anti-Tax Protest**

On April 10 SLL and the Libertarian Party held an Anti-Tax demonstration in front of the Federal Building in Santa Ana. More than 40 persons participated in the protest. Karl Bray was scheduled to speak at the

demonstration, but the feds kept him
in jail until after 'National Tax
Protest Day' had ended.

Donna Noble, wife of Karl Bray, David Bergland, vice-presidential candidate on the Libertarian Party ticket and Rod Boyer, vice-chair of SLL spoke at the protest.

After the speeches, a funeral march was led by four pallbearers and a coffin with a sign on it reading "Tomb of the unknown taxpayer." A 'Welcome Back Karl' reception was held that evening.

## PFP Is Changing

Recently a member of the socialist faction of the Peace and Freedom Party, Lewis McCammon, sent a letter to SLL and SLL members who are running for PFP Central Committee in Orange County. The letter expressed concern that the libertarian faction in the PFP is almost now non-existent.

It is true that the PFP libertarians are leaving the PFP. Lynn Kinsky, who was running on the PFP ticket for U.S. Senate, re-registered Libertarian Party. Also one of the main founders of the PFP, Michael Timko, has also left. And Lloyd Taylor, the former State Chairperson of the PFP, has been replaced by a socialist due to a ruling by March Fong Eu, California's Secretary of State.

Anyway, it seems strange to the SLL staff that the socialist PFP faction should be so concerned since they said that our odds of retaking the PFP is 13 to 1. The socialists also said that they want us libertarians to leave the PFP because we are just playing games with them. However, there doesn't seem to be a better name than peace and freedom to express libertarian ideals. Plus, the PFP was formed by both libertarians and socialist back in 1967.

There is no reason to abandon the PFP simply because they have re-taken control of its State Central Committee. It was this way before 1972 when the libertarians under Liz Keathley and Eric Garris libertarianized the PFP.
