

Comes to Santa

If anyone could be classified as 'Mr. Libertarian' of the West coast, it would have to be Robert LeFevre. Calling himself an "autarchist," LeFevre began teaching seminar courses in philosophy in 1957 at the Freedom School in Larkspur, Colorado.
A number of years later, LeFevre moved his school to Santa Ana and changed the name to Rampart College. It was at the famous Long Beach Conference in 1969 (Prof. Ludwig von Mises was the keynote speaker) in which LeFevre made a lasting impression on the emerging student libertarian movement.

After losing a bid for the 14th Congressional District seat in 1948, he worked for the United Taxpayers of California. Later he accepted a job with WQAM in Miami since he had some experience in radio. Two years later he became the news director for WFTL-TV in Fort Lauderdale. In 1954 he traveled to Colorado and became the editorial writer for the Colorado Spring Gazette Telegraph which was owned by the Freedom chain newspapers of lib-

ertarian R.C. Hoiles.



LeFevre is author of almost half a dozen books; his most recent is Lift Her Up, Tenderly. One of his most famous quotes is, "If men are good, you don't need government; if men are evil, or ambivalent, you don't dare have one." In recent years, Lefevre has started the publication of his own magazine call "LeFevre's Journal." "LeFevre's Journal is published quarterly foldward have 2252 Opening Ch 22660). GOY. BROWN & CHARITY

Libertarians often talk about getting government out of the charity business becuase of the bad effect on the community. Gov. Edmund Brown recently took a similar stand at a Catholic Charities of California meeting. Brown told the audience, "If you want the life of your institutions to increasingly depend on that (tax funds), then I think your institution is not long for this world."

The Catholic charity workers were seeking funds from state and federal funds. Brown warned, "You have to get individuals to give of themselves, or you will be absorbed by government." And again he said, "To the extent that the state expands, you get crowded out. The result is a lack of diversity, a monolith." (AP, May 3, 1977)

HOSPER'S SPEECH

University of Southern California Professor of Philsophy John Hospers, former director of the philosophy department at USC, spoke to an attentive crowd of more than 90 at Fullerton College (Feb. 1). Introduced by SLL Advisory Board member Devon Showley, Dr. Hospers' topic was "Will Freedom Survive Until 1984?"

Hospers warned that the federal government spent \$1,850 for "every man, woman and child" in the last fiscal year. Laughter echoed the lecture hall when he said that the Social Security system "operated on the principle of the chain letter." As for the question of whether freedom would survive, Hospers said that, "The battle was lost in the '30's. People don't resist any longer."
