The Draft Is Coming Back

The Body Snatchers are back and eager to sound the war drums. President Carter has asked Congress for money to reinstate draft registration which is a skip and a hop away from a full-time draft.

Libertarians are dead set against involuntary servitude in any form. Liberty means nothing if people are physically forced (i.e. kidnapped) to enlist in the military. Libertarians believe that each person is the sole proprietor of his/her own body. Therefore, libertarians see the draft as pure slavery, and something which must be opposed at all cost.

Three Exciting Debates

Seldom has more than one debate been scheduled at a libertarian conference. At this year's Future of Freedom Conference, three debates are planned.

The first debate will pit Lowell Ponte, author, KPFK radio commentator and editor of Politics Today (as well as an editor of Reason magazine), against Jonathan Wiener, an Associate Professor of History at

the University of California, Irvine. Wiener's specialty is Marxist philosophy. The debate "Libertarianism or Marxism: Which Direction for The Future?" is moderated by Roy Begley.

The second debate matches George Smith, author of Atheism: The Case Against God and a research fellow for the Institute for Humane Studies, against Jeffrey Johnson, an advocate of the Catholic Social Doctrine and chair of the Catholics in Defense of Truth. Entitled "Libertarianism or Conservatism: The Future of Victimless Crimes and Religion,' the debate will be moderated by Bud Lembke, an editorial writer for The Los Angeles Times.

The third debate (only one on April 20) will be of greatest interest George Smith

to Libertarian Party members and antiparty libertarians. Samuel E. Konkin, editor of New Libertarian and the originator of the term counter-economics will debate Manuel

Karl Hess is a former Republican Party speech writer for Barry Goldwater, President Nixon and Ford. Prof. Arthur Laffer is best known for his "Laffer Curve." A professor of Business Economics at USC, he is currently a member of the L.A. Times Board of Economists. Robert Anton Wilson is well-known as the author of the Illuminatus trilogy (with Robert J. Shea); Cosmic Trigger; Neuropolitics and The Game of Life (co-authored by Timothy Leary). John J. Matonis, attorney, is best known for several famous court cases involving Laetrile, tax striking, draft resistance and privacy. Robert LeFevre is the founder and first president of Rampart College and has authored several books. Prof. John Hospers, the former chair of USC Philosophy Department, ran for U.S. President in 1972 on the Libertarian Party ticket. He received one Electoral College vote. David Bergland, a USC law graduate, ran for U.S. Vice-President in 1976 on the Libertarian Party ticket. Currently, Bergland is running for U.S. Senate in California. Sandy Shakocius has co-authored the up-coming book Life Extension with Durk Pearson. She recently worked on Disney's movie The Black Hole. John Pugsley is the author of Common Sense Economics and his new book Alpha Strategy. Lowell Ponte, author of The Cooling, has been a KPFK radio commentator/show host for 11 years. 

Karl Hess is best known as a former Republican Party speech-writer for Barry Goldwater ("Extremism in the defense of liberty is no vice"), Presidents Nixon and Ford. A fromer editor of Newsweek, Hess is the author of Dear America. Robert Anton Wilson is the well-know author of the Illuminatus trilogy (with Robert Shea) and several other books co-authored with Timothy Leary. Arthur B. Laffer is best known for the "Laffer Curve." A full Professor of Business Economics at USC, Laffer is a member of the Los Angeles Times Board of Economists. John J. Matonis, attorney, has long championed anti-government causes, especially tax avoidance. **Sandy Shakocius** is the co-author of a book on life extension with Durk Pearson. She also worked on Disney's movie The Black Hole. John Hospers, a Professor (formerly director) of the School of Philosophy at USC, is author of eight books. Editor of The Personalist, Hospers ran for U.S. President in 1972 on the Libertarian Party ticket. John Pugsley is a successful businessman, investment advisor and author of Common Sense Economics. He has a new book out called Alpha Strategy. J. Neil Schulman is author of the new novel Alongside Night. David Bergland, attorney, was the 1976 Vice-Presidential candidate on the Libertarian Party ticket (Roger McBride was the Presidential candidate). Bergland is currently running for U.S. Senate in California. Carl Nicolai is the inventor of a commerical and CB voice scrambler that was banned by the National Security Agency. Bob McGinley, is president of the Society for Alternative Lifestyles. He is the founder of the oldest swing club in America.

(Dissent), Janice Allen.

The press heard strong opposition to the infringement of privacy. Some of the personal questions the Census wants to know are: whether you have been married more than once, the name of your household "partner" or "roommate," the value of your property, your rent payment, where you work, what you do, how much you earn and how you get to work.

The U.S. Constitution is quite precise about the Census, "Representatives shall be apportioned among the several states according to their respective numbers, counting the

whole number of persons in each State..." Period.

The Voluntary Census Committee urges everyone to 1. throw away the Census, 2. mail it to us or 3. answer head counting questions only. We have action Census cards to register your protest against this coercive government program. Just write to SLL for action cards and info.



Ludwig von Mises Was Key Speaker at First Conference

The first libertarian conterence of the Future of Freedom series was centered around one keynote speaker--Prof. Ludwig von Mises. Considered as the first libertarian conference held in the nation, the Ludwig von Mises Conference, as it is now named, was held at Cal State Univ., Long Beach in 1969. It attracted some 200 young students and launched the modern libertarian movement of today.

The Libertas Statement

We, as libertarians, affirm:
That full individual liberty is impossible in any society other than a voluntary one that agresses upon no one:
That men and women require the full and independent use of their own judgement in order to survive at an optimum level, and therefore have a natural right to do their own thing, providing that they do not physically harm or coercively restrict another individual's like, liberty or property:
That everyone is exclusively sovereign, and is a slave to no one;
That the individual is best served by society when he or she is free from the forcefully imposed controls of others, acting alone or in concert (as a government).

That all forms of coercion, aggression and fraud are always immoral;
That the only system consistent with personal freedoms in the economic
a is one that does not interfere with free trade between consenting

individuals:

THERFORE, we, as libertarians, resolve to oppose all forms of aggression by any State. Government, self-appointed savior, individual, or association of individuals. We further resolve to oppose taxation, conscription, eminent domain, laws which create victimitiess "crimes," and all programs forced onto individuals without their consent. It is time that the chains of authoritarianism in economics and morality be broken. Individual rights and occercion cannot co-exist. Liberty cannot be compromised, and we will settle for no less than freedom in our time.
