

ISN'T FORCED BUSING JUST ANOTHER WORD FOR KIDNAPPING?

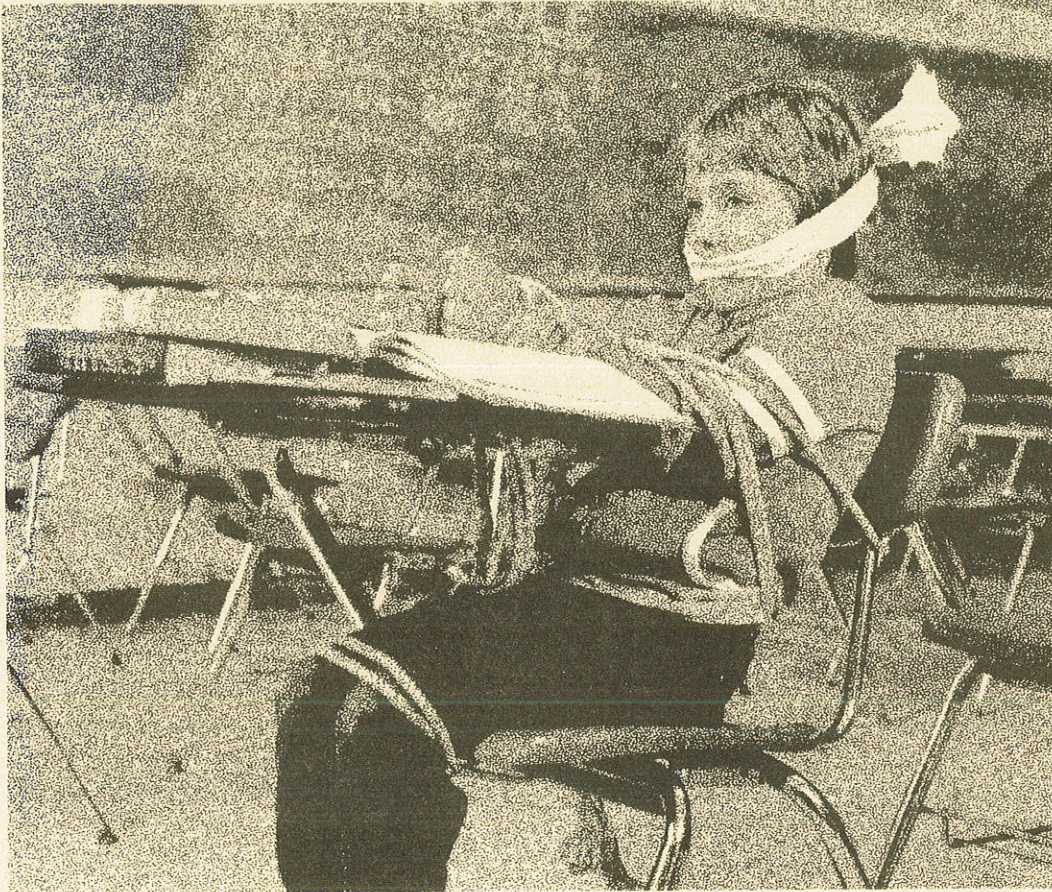

You would think that most people would see it as bright as day. Forced busing is nothing more than KIDNAPPING--plain and simple.

If anyone were to forcibly take a child and transport him to another section of town without parental consent, that individual would be arrested, convicted and jailed as a KIDNAPPER.

Yet the government, often with heavily armed guards, forcibly puts many children onto school buses daily without parental consent. Isn't this abduction? Isn't this KIDNAPPING? Isn't this just another double standard of government?

It makes you wonder...Whose children are they anyway? Apparently, not yours.

A greater question must be asked. Haven't we been asking for forced busing all along?

Under state education, the government warns parents that they 1) must have their child educated by a state approved or run educational system; [2] that their child must attend a school in a certain geographical area; and [3] that parents and non-parents alike must foot the bill.

Forced busing is just an extension of government educational practices. Kidnapping is legalized in this instance because the state considers children as a "National Resource" -- to be educated, regulated and controlled, so that they may become productive workers [and taxpayers] so that their children in turn will be taught by government educators and read government-supplied textbooks so that their children...

It's all there -- loyalty and obedience to a system of RULERS and the RULED, inbred with such notions since childhood, and conditioned to oppose alternatives.

It's the only game in town and whether one likes an educational monopoly or not, children will be forcibly bused and educated because "THE STATE CONTROLS WHAT IT OWNS AND OWNS WHAT IT CONTROLS."
